ORDINANCE NO. 51

REGULATING SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT
SUMMARY OF AMENDMENTS TO ORDINANCE

Amendments to Chapter 51 of the City’s Code of Ordinances for storage, collection, transportation, processing and disposal of solid waste within the city limits, were approved by majority vote of the City Commissioners on December 16th, 2015. The amendments approved are as follows;

- Section 51.02.9, Collection Frequency, residential customers may elect to add an additional day of weekly pick-up, for a total of two (2) days of weekly pick-up, for an additional charge;
- Section 51.02.5, Bulky Waste, in addition to the City of Hazard picking up bulky items monthly, bulky items may be picked up one (1) time per week on the residential customer’s normal garbage pick-up day by agreement with Rumpke for an additional charge;
- Section 51.01, Definitions, were amended to add definitions for Bags, Bundle, Containers, Convenience Centers, Residential Containers and Residential Units were added;
- Section 51.03.3, Standards for Residential Storage Containers, is amended to require that every residential customer shall use a Cart which can be provided by the residential customer, purchased from Rumpke or rented from Rumpke. In addition to the full Cart, a residential customer may also place two (2) bags, each 35 gallons, weighing no more than 50 pounds, out for collection. A Cart is defined under Residential Containers in the definition section of the ordinance as, “Cart- A receptacle made of plastic or fiberglass with a capacity not to exceed ninety-six (96) gallons, a loaded weight of no more than fifty (50) pounds with a tight-fitting lid.”;
- Section 51.02.6, Yard Waste, is amended to state that yard waste must be placed in carts, bundles or bags, with the individual bundles not exceeding forty (40) inches in length, thirty (30) inches in diameter and fifty (50) pounds of weight;
- Section 51.02.7, Regulated Waste, is amended to delete that this waste is to be collected monthly;
- Section 51.02.10, Ownership of Solid Waste, is amended to add that title to hazardous, special or regulated waste, not disposed of per law, remains with the generator of the waste;
- Section 51.10, Fees and Charges, rates for residential and commercial solid waste collection were set, as follows;

Class I

For collection from a dwelling unit
3 can, or equivalent, maximum: \$15.00 Rate Per Month

Class III

For collection from Multiple Housing or Multi-unit Commercial Facilities, in addition to the per dwelling Unit or class II fees established above, the owner

may provide a dumpster for use by the facility occupants at the following dumpster rental fees.

The Director may set a rate for additional service of said dumpsters should the owner desire more than one pickup per week.

Class IV

For collection from commercial, institutional, and industrial customers using the City’s dumpster collection service, per the following table for monthly service fees:

Class V Extra Labor Fee

Customers who place solid waste for collection in containers not approved under the provisions of this ordinance and customers who place yard waste that is not in an approved container are presumed to create extra labor costs for the City’s collection service and are assessed a charge equal To that customer’s monthly charge, as provided above, for each month or portion of a month that the aforesaid actions occur, to cover that extra labor cost.
